
The Aim






LOCATION:





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

C1. Mitigation of threats at nesting sites What has been done so far - Fencing



LIFE EUROTURTLES - LIFE15 NAT/HR/000997 Action C1: Mitigation of threats at nesting sites Fencing and Signs at Nesting Sites

Softades Beach:

"Fencing" with the use of wooden constructions for obstructing any vehicle access and to protect the turtle nests found on that beach. This wooden fence was completed in January 2017 and the cost was covered by the Kiti Council.



Lara Beach:

The Department of Fisheries and Marine Research (DFMR) in 2015 has proceeded with the repairing of the specific fence in an effort to protect the nests of the two sea turtles species in Lara bay during the nesting period of 2016. The cost was covered by the DFMR's own budget.



Pervolia (Faros) Beach:

Due to its elevation profile, fencing has been installed mainly for the safety of the general public and therefore there is no need for any further installation of a fence.













Improve the capacity to detect nests in need of specific protection in areas at risk of predation or inundation.

The current capacity is limited to on-foot ground surveys conducted by the limited personnel of DFMR and the marine turtle experts, over long coastal tracts.

As a consequence some tracts are inefficiently surveyed (low frequency and delayed intervention in case of need).





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3 areas on the southeastern part of Cyprus (Pervolia and Softades), where turtle nests are not adequately protected





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

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Benefits

- Faster survey for long areas
- Minimizing personnel time on field
- Rapid method
- Repeatable
- Developing accurate database
- Detect details that might be missed on sight
- Detect any illegal activities (i.e. car tracks)
- Extract Georeferenced nest location





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Next steps

- Scan all 10 studied beaches creating detailed maps to be used from field officers
- During nesting seasons
 - Collect aerial images two times a week
 - Extract possible nesting locations
 - Field validation and protection




Action C5: Rescue Centers and Networks **Turtle Rescue Kits**

The Department of Fisheries and Marine Research (DFMR) has purchased 5 turtle rescue kits (Boxes with handles, gloves, gauzes, saline solution), that were prepared and delivered at the DFMR in Nicosia on 17th May 2017.













C5. Rescue centres and networks: increasing sea turtle rehabilitation capacity What has been done so far

a) Turtle Rescue Kits delivered to the District Offices

During the month of June 2017, the "Rescue Kits" made under the Action C.5 "Rescue Centers and Networks", were disseminated in the Department of Fisheries and Marine Research (DFMR) District Offices in Paralimni, Larnaca, Limassol and Paphos. All personnel involved (Naval Service Staff and Fisheries and Marine Research Inspectors) were informed about the LIFE EUROTURTLES Project and its Actions and Goals. Everyone is now on-board and happy to help by providing the medic first aid to injured turtles before transferring them to the Meneou Turtle Rescue Center.


















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




Placement of collection bins for abandoned fishing gears (ghost gear) at Latsi port and the fishing shelters of Pomos and Kato Pyrgos.


















The discarded fishing gear are collected by ENERCO Energy Recovery Ltd and converted into energy, replacing the conventional fuels.

















GIS map with ghost gear locations, densities, and types.













- In total **285 kg** of abandoned ghost fishing gear (165 kilos from Latsi and 120 kilos from Pomos) were removed by the divers and placed in the bins that have been installed at the port of Latsi and at the fishing shelter of Pomos.
- Collection bins contained also fishing gear that were discarded by professional fishermen. In total 215 kg of useless fishing gear were discarded by professional fishermen. In particular, 105 kg of fishing gear were discarded in Pomos and 110 kilos in Kato Pyrgos.
- > In total 500kg of ghost gear were collected by an authorized company and converted into energy between 01/12/2017 and 29/08/2018.
